



IAU is not a funding agency

- Travel grants to IAU symposia and GA
- International School for Young Astronomers
 - > 3 per 2 years: training, also hands-on observations!
- Office of Astronomy for Development
 - OAD project call every year
 - DARA Big Data UK Newton fund, RAS visitors
 - **>**
- Office for Astronomy Outreach
- Office for Astronomy Education

Some European funding options

- EU Marie Curie Innovative Training Networks
 - > Up to 30 (PhD) positions per Network of 8-10 institutes
 - Also Individual MC fellowships
- European Research Council
 - ➤ Advanced 2.5 M€, Consolidator Grants 2.0M€
 - Can add up to 1 M€ for hardware
- National Funding for PhDs, PD, Hardware, Networks?

Example: Netherlands Research School for Astronomy (NOVA)

- Alliance of the four Dutch university astronomy institutes
- National funding for research networks and instrumentation program
 - NW3: Accretion, MultiMessenger ~10 PhD/PD every 5 yr
 - BlackGEM, pulsar machines, LO-FASTR,
